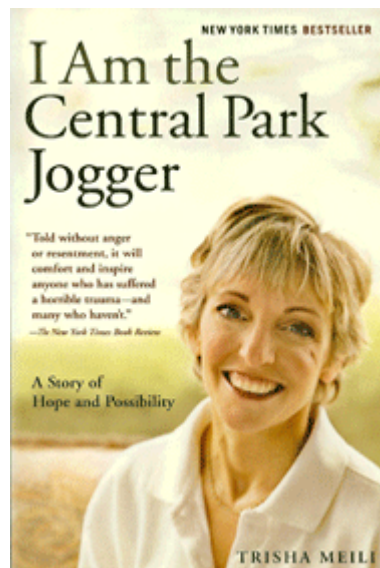

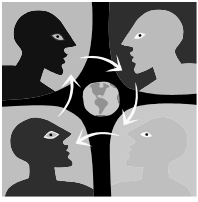

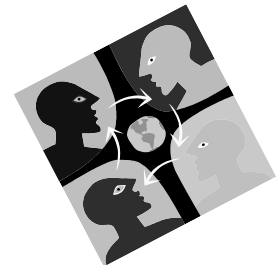
## Additional Information

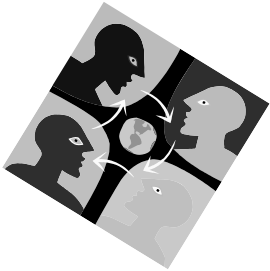
