- Sexual Assault is a violent crime of power and control.
- Every 45 seconds a woman in the United States is raped. (American Medical Association, AMA)
- Over 700,000 women are sexually assaulted each year in the United States. (National Center for Victims of Crime)
- 61% of victims are female under the age of eighteen. (AMA)
- 80% of sex crimes are committed by assailants known to the victim. (National Center for Victims of Crime)
- Less than 30% of sex crimes are reported to police. (National Center for Victims of Crime)
